1.3. Conflict of interest

CEQB members have an ongoing obligation to conduct themselves in an ethical, professional, and lawful manner, and to identify and disclose actual, reasonably perceived, and potential conflicts of interest. These obligations are set out in case law and are also codified in statute, under the *Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act* ("CNCA"). Members that cannot act in the best interests of Engineers Canada or are conflicted should recuse themselves from the relevant part of the meeting, and they shall not vote on the decision at hand. Members must support the legitimacy and authority of CEQB decisions, regardless of their personal position on the issue, and shall not publicly discuss the varying opinions of individual members.

4. Other CEQB

4.1 50-30 Working Group

Marcie Cochrane, Working group chair, presented

- Diversity of thought is a hallmark of successful boards, and without a systematic, strategic way
 to encourage this, decision making can become biased and unreflective of the profession of
 public that work is intended to serve.
- In April 2024, the CEQB determined that it would strike a 50-30 champions group to propose practices and recommendations that would facilitate thought diversity and help ensure alignment with Engineers Canada's 50-30 objectives.
- Subsequently, in September 2024, a working group was established to bring forward recommendations at the January CEQB meeting.
- In consultation with the CEQB Executive, the recommendation is to explore and implement process and practice improvements that enhance the culture and function of the board and support the desired goal to develop and maintain a CEQB composition that fosters diversity of thought. Actions to support this could include:
- 1. Training and education for the entire CEQB, such as workshops
- 2. Sharing optional resources and available learning opportunities
- 3. Review and adjustments to the new member onboarding process
- 4. Review of practices and policies to identify opportunities for improved inclusion and accessibility
- 5. Establishment of an inclusion moment at the beginning of meetings
- Develop of an attributes matrix and supplemental resources to support the desire to foster thought diversity and to meet the composition goals stated in the Engineers Canada Board Policy by creating a framework that:



- 1. Guides the assessment of various aspects of CEQB composition.
- 2. Identifies gaps and informs the desired attributes when recruiting new members.

THAT the CEQB explore and implement process and practice improvements that enhance the culture and function of the board AND THAT the 50-30 working group develop an attributes matrix and supplementary resources to provide the CEQB with a process that supports their ongoing efforts to achieve a diverse membership, as defined by Board policy was moved by Marcie Cochrane and seconded by Amy Hsiao. One abstained. None were opposed. The motion carried.

4.2 Proposed letter outlining the value of the CEQB

Frank Collins, CEQB Chair, presented:

The CEQB Executive Committee is seeking the committees support in drafting a letter outlining the value of the CEQB. This comes at a time of ongoing changes to Engineers Canada's structure which impacts the CEQB. The national perspective the CEQB brings to Engineers Canada is invaluable and preserving that perspective in the years to come will be critical. The purpose of this letter is to advise the Engineers Canada Board on what the future of the CEQB might look like and where the CEQB members see the most value in the support that can be provided to Engineers Canada. It was noted that the timing of this letter aligns with being proactive in having a member perspective to drive forward the future of the CEQB.

 - Secretariat will bring attention to items suggested/flagged at officials group meetings
