# Background

- CEOs and Executive Directors met virtually for half days on 10, 12 and 17 February 2026
- 11 Regulators were represented



# Continuing Professional Development

- **Objective**


Regulators are investigating a national, harmonized concept for Continuing Professional Development (CPD).

- **Current Status**

- Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) is leading the project, with updates to and guidance from the CEO Group.
- Consultation across all 12 regulators indicates a high level of alignment in existing CPD programs, with significant **commonality** across several key themes.

- **Next Steps**

- PEO to deliver a draft report to CEOG.
- Identify and articulate the common elements that could form the foundation for a desired national CPD program.



# Competency Based Assessment 2.0

- **Objective**


Review the components of the Pan-Canadian Competency-Based Assessment (CBA) framework and supporting platform to determine whether updates are required and that may support a future transition away from time-based experience requirements.

- **Current Status**

- British Columbia and Saskatchewan have had opening discussions and will lead an initial scoping exercise.

- **Key Considerations**

- The CEO Group emphasized the importance of aligning this work with related Qualifications Board (QB) activity on the CBA guideline review to avoid duplication and ensure coherence



# Interprovincial Mobility

- **Objective**


Review and discuss NAOG's work to streamline the Inter-Association Mobility Applicant (IAMA) Form.

- **Current Status**

- NAOG has undertaken work to simplify the IAMA Form.
- Regulators acknowledge progress but believe further simplification is possible.

- **Next Steps**

- Regulators will provide feedback to NAOG to further refine the form.



# Governance – CEQB/Officials Groups Interface

- **Objective**


To better understand how priorities are established and how work is routed within the EC ecosystem and how Members' perspectives (as represented through CEO Group-level direction) promote flexibility in prioritization.

- **Current Status**

- Discussion focused on NAOG/ Qualifications Board (QB) interface: how tasks and projects are identified, assigned, and prioritized.

- **Key Considerations**

- A broader discussion is underway regarding whether Officials Groups are the appropriate forum to tackle and review policy-related matters, recognizing that operational policy direction is typically regulator CEO-driven.
- This is part of the broader governance discussion.
